coalfield - An area where coal is mined.

Davy lamp – A safety lamp invented to reduce the risk of gas explosions.

fossil fuel – A natural fuel such as coal or gas which has formed from rotting plants and animals over millions of years.

natural gas – A flammable fuel found underground.


non-renewable energy – A source of energy that comes from fuels that cannot be replaced once it has been used.
