Music Curriculum Map - Assemblies

Objectives to cover in singing assemblies

Class 1

- A1 Sing in tune within a limited pitch range.
- C2 Beginning to start, join in and stop as appropriate.
- C3 To not shout, but sing.
- E4 Explain how noise is just a vibration. Put your hand on the front of your neck when you sing. What can you feel?
- F6 Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses.
- F7 Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody.

Class 2

- A4 Sing in tune with a greater pitch range.
- A7 Introduce dynamics with voice, loud and quiet.
- C4 Develop being able to start, join in and stop as appropriate, with slightly less adult support.
- C6 Begin to follow directions for dynamics (loud and quiet).
- E7 Remind the children that all noise is made by a vibration.

Class 3

- B13 Be able to clap along with the beat whilst singing a song. (Not clapping with each word or syllable.)
- C12 Start, join in and stop as appropriate, without adult support.
- C13 -Develop your ability to respond to musical cues. E.g a specific musical phrase (notes that they recognise aurally).
- C14 Follow directions for dynamics (loud and guiet) and tempo (speed)
- C15 Demonstrate your understanding of dynamic through movement and singing.

Class 4

- A17- Continue to sing a contrasting tune and lyrics in rounds increasing difficulty.
- A18 Begin to understand how to sing in harmony (two parts).
- A19 Sing confidently with good tone, strength and stamina.
- A20 -Control volume of voice using diaphragm.

Objectives to cover in normal assembly (entry music)
