SCA Funding Allocation

I am pleased to say, as a trust school, we now get access to a new revenue stream called School's Condition Allocation. This means we can bid for projects to be completed via a pot of money held centrally by the trust. We have bid for three projects this time (which have all been approved) and include rewiring work, resurfacing an area outside Class 3's cloakroom and upgrading some single glazed windows to double glazed. The three projects will cost in the region of £40,000 but will not come out of the school budget. This is a massive advantage of being a trust school and we look forward to having the work completed without impacting on our own finances.

Our Financial Situation



I wanted to take the opportunity to provide an update on the financial position of our school. Currently, we are in position in which we are spending more





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every year than is allocated to us. Under usual circumstances this would mean we would need to make staffing changes to address the overspend. Fortunately, Redhill recognise the effective work we are doing in school and are very much an education first, finance second trust. As a result, the trust are supporting our school financially so we can maintain staffing levels and therefore protect the standard of education currently offered. That said, we do need to continue to be mindful when spending money and find ourselves – like many other schools – in a position in which we are less able to subsidise trips and other activities for families.

Water Bottles

As vou know. it is massively important for children to drink plenty of water during the school day. We have noticed that a small number of children are not bringing a water bottle to school and so have to borrow one from school. Bringing a water bottle is an essential so please do ensure your child brings their own to school each day.



School Bags

As a such a small school, I am sure you can appreciate that we often struggle for space. This is particularly apparent in the cloakroom areas – especially in Class 3.



Please could you consider whether you could reduce the size of the school bag your child brings each day. As a result of cramped cloakrooms, coats often end up on the floor and then run the risk of being damaged. Almost everything children need at school is provided for them so there is very little need for a large rucksack.
