

Scarcliffe Primary School - Dress Code Policy January 2026

At Scarcliffe Primary School, we believe that a dress code reflects our commitment to equality, safety, and high expectations for all pupils whilst contributing to a positive and focused learning environment. Our dress code policy is designed to promote a sense of pride, unity and respect among our pupils. We kindly request the cooperation of all parents, guardians and pupils in adhering to the following quidelines:

1. Tops:

- Pupils are required to wear a blue jumper or cardigan as part of their uniform.
- A sky blue or white polo t-shirt or shirt must be worn.
- Plain, non-branded jumpers or cardigans in blue are acceptable.

2. Bottoms:

- Pupils may wear dark trousers, shorts or skirts that are either grey, black or navy blue.
- Skirts should be approximately knee length.
- Often, children choose to wear cycling shorts under their skirts and this is allowed.

3. Footwear

• Fully black school shoes, trainers or boots should be worn. Sandals are permitted for safety reasons.

4. Summer Dresses:

• During warmer months, pupils are permitted to wear blue, checked summer dresses as part of the dress code.

5. Earrings:

- While we prefer that pupils do not wear earrings, those who choose to wear them must be able to remove them independently.
- Any earrings that are worn must be small, stud earrings. No hoop or large earrings are allowed.
- Pupils must remove earrings before participating in physical education (PE) activities. Please note that staff cannot help with this. Therefore, children need to be able to remove them independently.

• As piercings need to heal for 6 weeks, we strongly encourage parents and carers to think carefully about when children have ears pierced. The start of the summer holiday is the preference.

6. Watches and Jewellery:

- Pupils are allowed to wear watches.
- Smart watches are allowed where they do not have a camera.
- No other jewellery (including bracelets, necklaces or rings) is permitted due to health and safety reasons.

7. Uniform Branding:

- Uniform items may be branded if purchased through Sprint Sports, although this is not a requirement.
- Non-branded uniform items are also acceptable.

8. PE Uniform:

- On PE days, pupils should attend school in their PE kit. This avoids the need to bring kit separately and ensures readiness for lessons. Pupils should still wear appropriate outerwear for the weather.
- For PE lessons, pupils are required to wear a plain sky blue or white tshirt. Children can bring a plain hoody or jacket to wear in colder weather.
- Blue or black shorts, joggers or leggings are to be worn during PE sessions.
- For outdoor PE activities, pupils must have a pair of trainers.
- For indoor PE activities, pupils should have a pair of plimsolls.

9. Makeup:

- Pupils should not wear makeup to school this includes nail varnish.
- Staff will ask children to remove make-up.

10. Equality and inclusion:

 Reasonable adjustments will be made for pupils with SEND or for religious/cultural requirements

We appreciate the cooperation of parents, guardians, and pupils in adhering to the dress code policy. By doing so, we create a sense of equality and unity among our
